

Carbon Border Adjustment Mechanism (CBAM)

The Carbon Border Adjustment Mechanism (CBAM) aims to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and address carbon leakage. CBAM is the EU's tool to put a fair price on the carbon emitted during the production of carbon intensive goods that are entering the EU, and to encourage cleaner production in non-EU countries.

CBAM helps to maximise the European and the global impact of our fight against climate change. CBAM entered into application in its transitional phase on 1 October 2023. The permanent system will enter into force on 1 January 2026.
